
WHEREAS, ACWA and its public agency members will continue to seek a vision for California’s water future.



 "We're pretty much swamped first thing in the morning," said Mesa.
 She hopes a new computer lab will decrease that wait time and allow more people to use the library for that reason.
 The library has also seen an increase in patron traffic due to the recession. Many people come to the library with questions and looking for resources concerning unemployment and other government programs.
 The library is working with the

City of Rialto to complete the project. The city has agreed to construct the enclosure of the patio and help fund the cost of the project. In fact, the former branch manager, Roslyn Dones, worked with the city for years to get the expansion project off the ground.

In addition to the construction and the city's financial contribution, the library is also working to raise money for furnishings and equipment in the new space. According to Mary Taylor of the Friends of the Rialto Library, they hope to raise \$50,000 for the project.

The Rialto Friends of the Library will continue their work supporting the library through fundraisers for this project as well. But they are looking for community support.

In addition to the books sales they do regularly they will also hold fundraisers throughout the year.

"Let's all help make this project attainable," wrote Taylor. "Our new computer lab will make all of our children become more knowledgeable and help make school work easier."
